Mid-Term Examination Schedule

The following is the North Warren Regional High School Mid-term Exam Schedule for 2010.

Exam days 1,2,3 and 4 will be early dismissal days at 12:15. Exam day 5 will dismiss at 2:20.

Examinations will be given in a period by period format. Each exam period will be 132 minutes long.

Examination Procedures

- Students must discharge all obligations in semester courses (textbooks, monies, etc.) due the school before they take their first exam.
- Time allotted for each exam is 132 minutes. Students are required to remain in the exam room until the end of the exam period. Bring something to study or read in case you finish your exam early.
- Examination rooms are “no talking” environments. Students who are disruptive will be removed from the exam room and will be in jeopardy of receiving a zero (0) on the exam.
- No hall passes will be issued to students during exams.
- **Seniors** may plan to arrive late or leave early if they have no scheduled exams or classes. A parental note is required for seniors who wish to leave early if they have no scheduled exams or classes. All other students **must** bring a parental permission note to the attendance clerk **each day** of exams that they wish to leave early or arrive late, if they have no scheduled exams or classes.
- All students who arrive late or leave early **must** sign in or out with the attendance clerk. Please use the main entrance to enter and leave the building.
- A student who misses a scheduled exam must present a professional note (doctor, dentist, lawyer, court) in order to receive a make-up examination. Students with unexcused absences during an exam will receive a zero (0) for the missed exam.
- Students who arrive late for an exam period will not be allowed to take the scheduled exam.
- Make-Up exams will be scheduled through the guidance office.



Examination Study Hints

Prior to exam week:

- Organize class notes and begin to review them a week or two before the exam.
- Use study guides to focus your study. Ask questions if confused.
- Set up a study schedule. Study for one subject at a time.
- Get plenty of rest the week before exams.
- Do not try to cram for exams. Stress and fatigue results in poor retention of information.
- Study in a “learning community” with other students who are taking the same exam. Often times studying with one or more fellow students can help you better understand and retain information. And it is more fun!

During the Exam:

- Review notes before an exam starts
- Be positive! Visualize yourself doing well on the exam.
- Take time to read the directions carefully.
- Read each question carefully.
- Do the easier questions first.
- Budget your time by the importance of the question. Essay questions are generally more important than multiple-choice questions. Do the important questions first.
