



FEVER	DIARRHEA	VOMITING	RASH	COUGH	EYE INFECTION	COVID			
When to stay home from school									
Temperature of IOO.5 or over	within the last 24 hours	within the past 24 hours	with fever or itching, or unknown cause	persistent cough with trouble breathing, high fever and/or excessive mucous production	redness, itching, crusty, or drainage	first day of symptom onset counts as Day Zero			
When to return to school									
fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication administered	free from diarrhea for 24 hours and no fever	free from vomiting for 24 hours, ability to hold down solids and fever free	diagnosed by MD, return time varies related to cause of rash	cough is under control and not distracting to other students, fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication	24 hours on antibiotic and no further drainage	may return on Day 6 if symptoms are reduced and fever free for 24 hours. Mask encouraged day 6-IO unless covid negative on day 6 and 8, may return on day 8 without a mask			




Labyrinth Projects with Mrs. DellaBella
